**K**eene State College's School Counselor programs are designed for individuals interested in achieving certification as a Guidance Counselor and demonstrating that they possess the knowledge, skills, and dispositions of more seasoned professional educators who can advocate for all students, act as catalysts for school reform, and provide leadership in educational transformation.

The curriculum combines certification coursework, including 600 hours of school-based application for demonstration of competence, and culminates with the design and implementation of a practical research project that showcases an individual student's area of expertise and capacity for leadership. Students learn how to create developmental counseling programs that are comprehensive in nature and foster equity among all members of the school community. Individual courses integrate theory with practice so students gain a deeper understanding of the complex roles and responsibilities of the comprehensive school counselor and develop relevant counseling skills and strategies.

The School Counselor programs are based on the American School Counselor Association National Model and meet certification competencies established by the New Hampshire Department of Education for Guidance Counselor (K-12).

### Program Highlights

- The 48 credit M.Ed. can be completed in two years (full-time) or three years (part-time).
- The 30 credit Post-Master's can be completed in two years.
- Classes are typically available late afternoon to evening, and some weekends.

- Field-based courses require students to apply course content in a K-12 school setting.
- Students demonstrate competence as a school counselor via two pre-approved internships completed in the fall and spring of the final year. The elementary level and the secondary level internships are 300 hours each.

### Program Outcomes

With the guidance and support of faculty and field-based professionals, students will:

- understand the complex roles and responsibilities of today's school counselor.
- study a range of counseling theories and practice active listening with authentic response.
- create a dynamic, data-driven comprehensive school counseling program.
- demonstrate professional and ethical behaviors that meet high expectations and standards.
- understand the world from multiple perspectives.
- contribute to a more just and equitable world.

Each year, Keene State College's graduate programs in education address the professional development needs of hundreds of aspiring and experienced educators. The success of our students and programs is based, in part, upon a long and productive history of collaboration between KSC and our professional associates in pre-K to 12th grade schools. Year after year, schools welcome our advanced students into their classrooms. Our graduates are valued highly and are employed by public and private schools throughout New England and beyond.

## Accreditation

---

Keene State College graduate programs in Education are grounded in standards developed by nationally recognized professional organizations and are accredited by one or more of the following agencies: the New England Association of Schools and Colleges, the National Council for Accreditation of Teacher Education (NCATE), or the New Hampshire State Department of Education. In addition, each graduate program is framed using standards developed by a Specialty Professional Association (SPA) that delineates the knowledge, skills, and dispositions educators should possess. SPA standards are consistently used in KSC graduate programs for planning courses and field experiences, and establishing criteria for evaluating student performance and overall outcomes.

## Admissions

---

Keene State College considers applications on a rolling admissions basis. Students are encouraged to apply up to six months in advance of scheduled classes.

Candidates for admission to a program of Graduate Study must submit the appropriate application, including required materials, to Graduate Admissions, 229 Main St, Keene NH 03435-2605.

Preference will be given to applications completed by MARCH 1 for programs that begin with SUMMER classes; APRIL 1 for programs that begin with FALL classes; and NOVEMBER 1 for programs that begin with SPRING classes.

## Financing Your Education

---

Students admitted into a graduate program are eligible to apply for financial assistance whether enrolled full-time or part-time. Candidates should complete the Free Application for Federal Financial Aid (FAFSA) online at [www.fafsa.ed.gov](http://www.fafsa.ed.gov) and visit the Student Financial Services website at [www.keene.edu/sfs/](http://www.keene.edu/sfs/) for more information. Requests for financial aid are evaluated after KSC receives FAFSA results and the applicant has been admitted into an approved program.

A limited number of graduate assistantships are available. Furthermore, a modest fellowship and scholarship exist to help qualified matriculated graduate students meet their educational expenses. Professional development funds may be available to individuals employed in a pre-K to 12 school or district.
