Required Academic Foundation in the Liberal Arts

Prospective teachers must have earned a bachelor's degree with a major area of concentration that consists of at least 10 courses (30 credit minimum) above the introductory level which demonstrates in-depth study in one of the following fields: (1) Humanities; (2) Fine arts; (3) Social sciences; (4) Mathematics; (5) Sciences or (6) an Interdisciplinary major comprised of no fewer than 10 courses (30 credit minimum) with at least 5 from the same field and the majority, six or more, of the courses above the institution's introductory level in the other fields listed in (1) through (5) above.

Additional coursework may be required if an individual's academic preparation does not contain enough depth or breadth in the liberal arts.

Audition Requirement

Each student desiring admission to Keene State College as a music major is required to pass an audition with a member of the music faculty. When requesting an audition, students must specify which instrument or voice on which they intend to audition. All students are encouraged to apply and audition early in the year to ensure eligibility for appropriate financial assistance.

Each student will be sent an Audition Data Form for contact information, musical and academic interests, a list of all repertoire studied and/or performed, and a list of pieces to be performed at the audition. Please complete and return this form to the Music Department at least two weeks prior to the audition.

A music theory placement test will be administered to each music applicant on the day of the audition. Students with no or little theory background are encouraged to find a tutor, a web site (e.g., www.musictheory.net), software, and/or a self instruction book to become familiar with the basic theory and notation of music (clefs, key signatures, intervals, chords, grand staff, rhythmic notation, meters, time signatures).

Matriculation

Matriculation into the Post-Baccalaureate Teacher Certification Program (PBTCP) is the equivalent to being admitted into an undergraduate Teacher Education program. Students in the PBTCP are responsible for reading the Requirements and Organization of Undergraduate Teacher Education (ROUTE) handbook that is available at the KSC Bookstore or on the web at: http://academics.keene.edu/ROUTEHandbook/StudentTeaching.htm.

Progression through the PBTCP is largely dependent upon a student's ability to meet the following criteria: *Grades:* You must maintain a 2.5 or higher overall cumulative GPA. In addition you must have no grade lower than a C and a 2.5 or higher in your certification option courses, and a 2.5 or higher GPA in your content major courses. *Personal social/behavioral dispositions:* Your KSC student affairs record will be checked, and a Criminal Records check will be completed through the NH State Police Department and the FBI. Dispositions assessments will be conducted as part of various courses in the PBTCP.
